About the Premier's Awards

The NSW Premier's Awards recognise outstanding performance and achievements in the delivery of public services to the NSW community by the public sector, and not-forprofit organisations and private businesses in partnership with public sector agencies and departments.

The Premier's Awards are comprised of 8 categories, which recognise the broad spectrum of work delivered across the sector aligning with the government's commitments.

The Premier's Awards team liaises with Awards Ambassadors in each department or agency to support the coordination of nominations.

Award categories

Team award categories

World class education and training

Recognising the importance of lifelong education and training opportunities with a focus on improving positive outcomes for the people of NSW.

This category includes programs, initiatives, innovations or improvements that:

- Create opportunities and access to lifelong learning, helping people develop skills for the future.
- Demonstrate an improvement of education outcomes.
- Have invested in the recruitment and training of educators with demonstrated results.

Highest quality healthcare

Improving services to ensure that everyone has access to world-class healthcare when and where they need it.

This category includes programs, initiatives, innovations or improvements that:

- Demonstrate better health services through accessibility and upgrading.
- Provide opportunities for people to have quicker and easier access to the healthcare system.
- Extend quality services into regional and remote communities.

Connecting communities

Creating communities where people enjoy living and visiting by providing them with high-quality facilities and amenities.

This category includes programs, initiatives, innovations, or improvements that:

- Contribute towards shaping a strong and liveable NSW.
- Make transport accessible and affordable for all.
- Provide greater access to quality, green and public spaces.
- Reduce carbon emissions and help improve air quality.

Building a resilient economy

Growing an economy that works in the interests of its people.

This category includes programs, initiatives, innovations, or improvements that:

• Create opportunities for improving the cost of living for the people of NSW.

- Support local manufacturing and NSW businesses.
- Provide support and fairer opportunities for renters and first home buyers.

Excellence in service delivery

Celebrating teams who continue to demonstrate the positive contribution they are making for the people of NSW through a range of services.

This category includes programs, initiatives, innovations, or improvements that:

- Recognise the everyday teams who consistently give their all each day and are committed to doing their best work by maximising their impact no matter what their role.
- Demonstrate an increase in customer satisfaction and deliver positive outcomes.
- Strive to continually improve on people focused service delivery and design.

Driving public sector diversity

We deliver greater benefits for the people of NSW when our workforce is as diverse as the people we serve. We enable workplaces where everyone is valued and can participate.

This category includes programs, initiatives, innovations, or improvements that:

- Build the foundations and structures for a diverse and inclusive workforce.
- Demonstrate thriving healthy workplaces and employee wellbeing.
- Demonstrate outstanding leadership developing future leaders.

Individual award categories

Anthea Kerr Award

The Anthea Kerr Award is awarded in honour of Anthea Kerr who passed away suddenly at 38 years of age. The award is to recognise future public sector leaders and will be awarded to a maximum of two individuals each year. It will be awarded to people who exhibit in their work a deep commitment to public sector values and identified leadership potential – attributes that Anthea exemplified throughout her working life.

Recipients must be under the age of 35 as of 1 July 2023.

NSW Public Servant of the Year

Recognising exemplary work and outstanding leadership from an individual working for the NSW Government.

Promoting the awards

You can use the key messages and sample communication below to support promotion of the Premier's Awards nomination period across your organisation.

Use your understanding of your employees and organisation to adapt the communication so that they're most effective. You may like to emphasise nominations in a particular category relevant to your organisation or promote a different category each week throughout the nomination period.

To attract nominations from your organisation, we recommend including or showcasing previous winners or finalists from your department/agency.

Awards Ambassadors can access and view previous nominations via the manage nominations tab in the online portal.

Key messages for promoting the nomination period

- The Premier's Awards highlight and celebrate the world-class services delivered by the NSW public sector to the people of NSW.
- Nominating for the awards is an opportunity to showcase the important projects we work on to deliver for the citizens of NSW.
- Selection as a finalist is a highly regarded and recognised title demonstrating the highest levels of achievement in the NSW public sector.
- Nominating for the awards is an easy online process. Your Department/Agency Awards Ambassador is available to assist you during this process.
- This year there are 6 categories for team nominations and two categories for individual nominations. Categories are aligned to the NSW Government's commitments.
- Award nominations open Monday 29 May 2023 and close June 2023 and can be submitted using the <u>online portal</u>. [Or insert organisation-specific submission information and date, if conducting own internal review process]
